Faith Team gathered the following information about what our pupils have learnt about our Christian value of 'Faith' and how this links to all of our British Values.

"Our Faith value links to all of the other school values, less so to Forgiveness though." Year 4 pupil

"Faith can mean religion – your faith/religion." Year 3 pupil

"Christians have faith that God will help them when they need it." Year 4 pupil

"Sometimes people can doubt their faith when things are tough, but believing in God can help too." Year 4 pupil

"You don't have to have the same faith as other people or even the same as your friends or family, you can choose a faith that is right for you." Year 5 pupil

"It is your Individual Liberty to choose your faith." Year 4 pupil

"It's ok not to have a faith at all." Year 2 pupil

"If you don't have a faith or you have a different faith to other people, it is important to show respect/tolerance for those differences. You can ask questions about other people's faith to help you understand better." Year 4 pupil

"Faith can actually link to forgiveness, because we should forgive people who do not respect our faith." Year 6 pupil

"We should always show pride in our faith, be proud of ourselves and what we believe in." Year 3 pupil

"You can have faith in yourself or someone else and it means to believe in yourself or them." Year 6 pupil

"The disciples had to show faith in Jesus (even though they were worried) and he calmed the storm."
Year 1 pupil

"If you have faith in yourself then you are showing resilience and it helps you to overcome challenges." Year 6 pupil

"Having faith in someone else means that you trust them." Year 2 pupil

"Faith also links to democracy, because we have to have faith in the people we vote for." Year 3 pupil

"Sometimes you have to have faith in people that you don't know, because they are there to help us and we have to trust them – a little bit like The Good Samaritan." Year 2 pupil
