We gathered the following information about what our pupils have learnt about our value of 'Respect' this half term.

"Respect means that you treat people how you would want to be treated." Y2 pupil

"We can show respect by just being friendly, polite, kind and caring." Y5 pupil

"We should show respect to everyone we meet - in school, the community and the world." Y5 pupil

"In the bible, the Good Samaritan showed respect, even though the other men didn't and despite the Jewish man having different beliefs. We should do the same and respect anyone and everyone we meet, even if they have different beliefs to us." Y6 pupil

"Respect is about understanding and accepting people's uniqueness, behaviour, personal challenges and differences – it's linked to Mutual Respect." Y5 pupil

"If we show respect to other people's religions, they will respect ours and we will learn something new from them." Y4 pupil

"We should show respect in our community (even though some people don't) to the environment and to people." Y3 pupil

"We can show respect by helping people, gifting to charities, raising money, litter picking, planting trees/plants/flowers." Y4 pupil

"We have earned our Community Respect badges if we have 'gone out through the door' and made a difference." Y2 pupil

"We learned that we need to show more respect to God's World by making lots of little changes that help care for the environment." Y3 pupil

"We can reduce/reuse/recycle and help to save water and electricity." Y1 pupil

"Through pollution and deforestation we are not respecting the world that God gave us to care for, we are supposed to be its guardians." Y6 pupil
