"Forgiveness means that if someone has done something wrong and they say sorry, you should forgive them." Y6 pupil

"Even if someone doesn't say sorry for doing something to hurt or annoy you, you should still try to forgive them." Y4 pupil

"God says that we should always try to forgive people." Y2 pupil

"In the bible, Jesus teaches people that you should say 'please, thank you, sorry and I forgive you' through the story of the Prodigal Son." Y5 pupil

"Jesus forgave the people who betrayed him and sacrificed him on the cross." Y6 pupil

"When you say sorry, you should mean it and do your very best not to do it again." Y3 pupil

"When you forgive someone, you should let go any frustration/hurt/anger otherwise you are holding a grudge and not forgiving properly." Y4 pupil

"Rule of Law is linked to Forgiveness, because if you break rules or laws there are punishments, but you can be forgiven after you have completed your punishment." Y5 pupil

"If you go to prison and serve your time, you can be forgiven and let out to live your life again and be a better person." Y6 pupil

"We have rules and laws to help keep us safe from danger." Y1 pupil
