Faith Team gathered the following information about what our pupils have learnt about our Christian value of 'Pride' and British value of 'Individual Liberty' this half term.

"Pride means we are pleased with ourselves, someone else or of something." Y6 pupil

"You can be proud of other people, not just yourself." Y1 pupil

"Individual liberty means that we can be whoever we choose to be and should be proud to be what we are." Y6 pupil

"We must respect people's choices to be who they want and do the things they choose, even if it's different to us. We don't all have to believe in the same things but we still have to show respect to others." Y4 pupil

"I like being proud of myself and I sometimes get a sticker." EYFS pupil

"You can be proud of your belongings and take pride in looking after them." Y5 pupil

"You can be proud to be part of a team, sometimes even more proud if they win." Y4 pupil

"If you are too proud it can be boastful. It is important not to make other people feel rubbish about themselves if you are being too proud of something you have done and they haven't." Y3 pupil

"The Story of Creation teaches us that after making the world and universe, God rested on the 7^{th} day and was proud of what he had created." Y6 pupil

"God created people to look after the world he had created and was proud of." Y5 pupil

"Noah was also proud of himself because after showing resilience to build the ark, he was proud that he had achieved it." Y2 pupil

"In some ways we can be proud of what we have managed to do in our world, but we have not looked after it well enough because of pollution, deforestation, dumping rubbish and not recycling enough." Y5 pupil

"We can help by not dropping litter and picking up litter." Y1 pupil

"We can recycle properly, or use things that can be re-used. We can recycle paper, plastic, glass, metal, clothes, toys." Y2 pupil

"We can plant more trees and flowers to replace the ones we have chopped down, because we will still need to chop down trees sometimes." Y3 pupil

"We can help by: turning off lights when we leave a room; turning off a TV we are not watching; turn off the tap when we brush our teeth; walk instead of drive short journeys; reuse bottles or buy bars of soap; grow fruit/veg ourselves." Collaborative response
